I invite you to say a silent prayer asking God to bless the seeds, seedlings, and soil. You might hold them close to your heart.

I invite you to say a silent prayer asking God to bless our neighbors who will eat the food we grow here, holding them close to your hearts as well.


We ask this through Jesus Christ, through whom all things were made.
